For Authors: Before you submit, please ensure that the following items are present:

1. All authors names, affiliations, complete postal address and working email IDs, and one author should have been designated as the corresponding author.
2. Manuscript file in MS word format (prepared strictly as per the guidelines)
3. All tables and figures/images including relevant captions (prepared as per guidelines)
4. Declarations/Ethics statement signed by corresponding author
5. Three preferred reviewers' names and their contact details
6. Supplemental files (where applicable)

Author Guidelines

Thank you for choosing our Journal. Please prepare your manuscripts according to the following guidelines for the smooth publication of your article.

Manuscript Preparation

The manuscript should be typed in double spacing on A4 size paper, leaving 1 inch (2.54 cm) margin on all sides. The Manuscript should be prepared strictly as per the following guidelines:

- Use standard symbols of Units conforming to the International System of Units (SI). Some examples are km, m, cm and mm.
- For abbreviations, standard international practices should be used. The complete form of all abbreviations should be given at their first citation.
- Tables and figures/photos should be numbered using Arabic numerals and kept where they need to be put. They should be supplied with headings referred to as Table/figure 1, 2 etc. Coloured figures and photos should be sent only if necessary (black and white are preferred). Illustrations taken from an outside source should be accompanied by an authority (reference).

For Research article

- Page 1 of the paper should contain the following:
 1. Title of the paper (concise and descriptive)

2. Author(s) name(s)
 3. Author(s) affiliations (Department and Institution)
 4. Postal address, Email, telephone/phone numbers of the Corresponding Author
- Page 2 should be followed by the Abstract (about 200 words), 5-8 Keywords and Text proper. **Abstract:** Should be in a single paragraph and indicate significant findings of the work **Key words:** Should adequately index the subject matter. They should be arranged in alphabetical order.

The text proper: Should be subdivided into sections:

1. Introduction
 2. Materials and Methods
 3. Results
 4. Discussion
 5. Acknowledgements
 6. References
- Do not use capital letters for author names and headlines. All scientific terms, from the level of genus downward, should be made italics (e.g., *Rattus rattus*).
- **The introduction** should precisely include the aims of the study. It should be concise and specific, with no sub-headings.
- **Materials and Methods** should be sufficiently detailed to enable the experiments done. The techniques and methodology adopted should be supported with standard references.
- **Results** should be clear and concise.
- **Discussion** should explore the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. Combined results and discussion are also acceptable.
- Authors should submit contributions statements of all authors, which will be published with the final article.
- **Conflict of interest statement** Authors should declare if there is any conflict of interest while submitting the manuscripts.
- **Acknowledgements** should include the names of those who contributed substantially to the work described in the manuscript but do not fulfil the requirements for the authorship. It should also have the sponsor or the funding agency of the project.

1. Introduction

2. Discussions

3. References

For views/views

This would be a free article of the author's choice of format.

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
